The Lawshe Method was used to narrow the 44 suggested InTASC related items to 22. These 22 items are all being assessed by cooperating teachers in a pilot study during the spring of 2019. SEGS faculty, methods faculty members, and representative P12 teachers involved in the process. Focus groups were established to engage the experts who have the best perspective about which dispositions could be assessed in the varying experiences.

K-12 and Secondary Methods Teachers data gathered on 4/29/19 and 4/30/19. N = 9 Methods Teachers.

SEGS and Elementary Methods Teachers data gathered on 5/3/19 and 5/6/19. N = 11 Methods Teachers and 16 SEGS overall.
